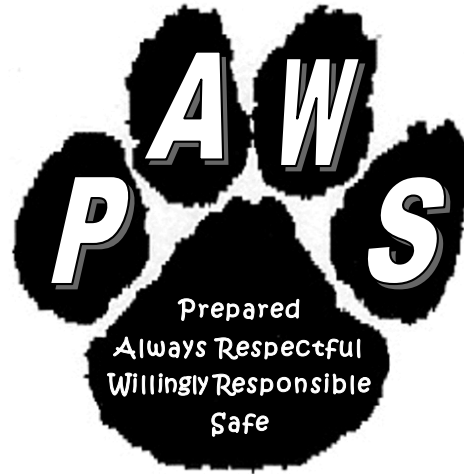


PAWS

PAWS Bucks

Students that use their PAWS behavior and follow the school rules of being prepared, always respectful, willingly responsible and safe can receive a PAWS Buck for displaying positive behaviors. These PAWS Bucks are used like money to get prizes, special events, and many other things and special jobs. Students can pick what they would like to earn.



Our PAWS program is based in four areas: behavior, academics, attendance and parent involvement. Here is an outline of the different program in each of those areas.

Behavior

PAWS Bucks

PAWS Bucks are given to all students from any staff member for showing their PAWS behavior.

PBIS School Store

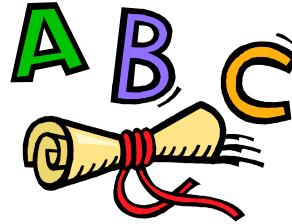
Students will be able to use their PAWS Bucks at a monthly PBIS School Store. Bucks may be used to purchase privilege passes, such as using a special chair, being an office helper, being an administrator's apprentice, and an assortment of other privileges and special events.

Academic

Academic Achievement Awards

Students in grades 1-4 who maintain a 3.0 grade average in Reading, English, Math, Science and Social Studies (with no grades lower than a "C" and O's and S's) will receive recognition on Honor Day. Pre-K and K students must have no Needs Development in Reading and Math and are

proficient in the on-going Reading and Math skills for the team.



Term Challenges

The Assistant Principals will challenge students each term to demonstrate "Good Behavior Days" with few or no office referrals. Challenges include the Assistant Principals dressing in orange and blue, Sumo wrestling, etc.



Attendance

Daily Classroom Attendance

Each primary grade Classroom gets to fill in a letter or PERFECT ATTENDANCE for each day the class is all present – they win prizes.

Attendance Awards

Each student that meets the requirements of the Wicomico County Board of Education or attendance will receive an award at Honor Day.
